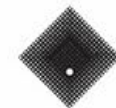

3 We achieve our target score on an Inclusion Index.

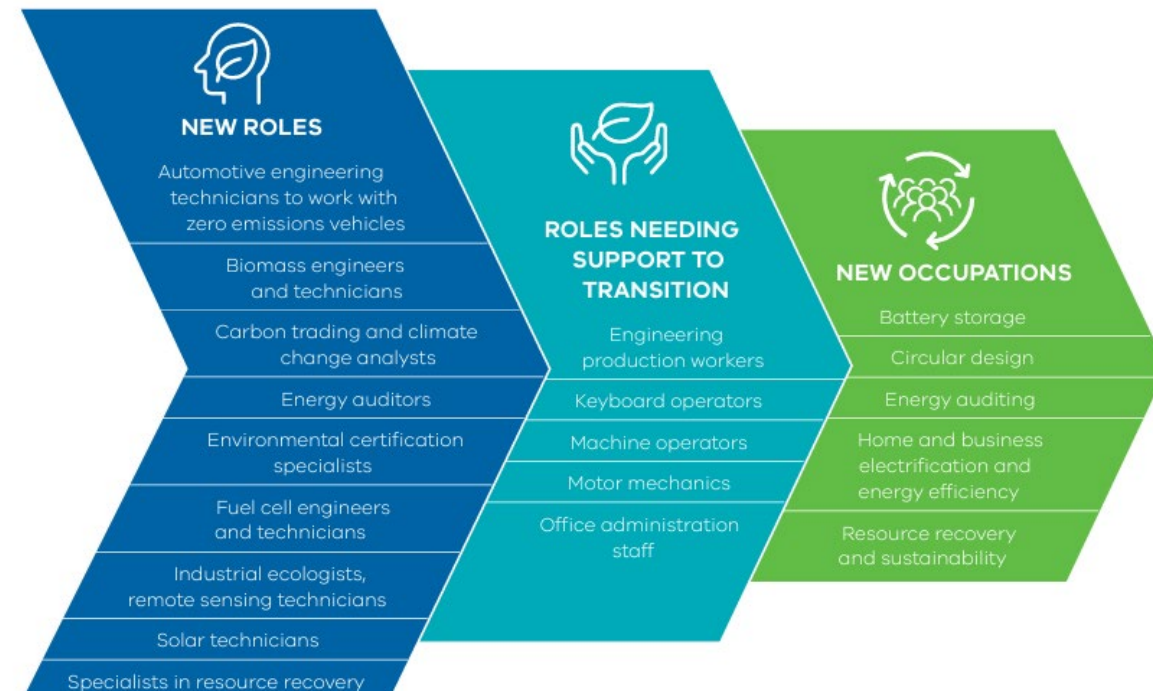
4 We will reduce our emissions footprint by 50%

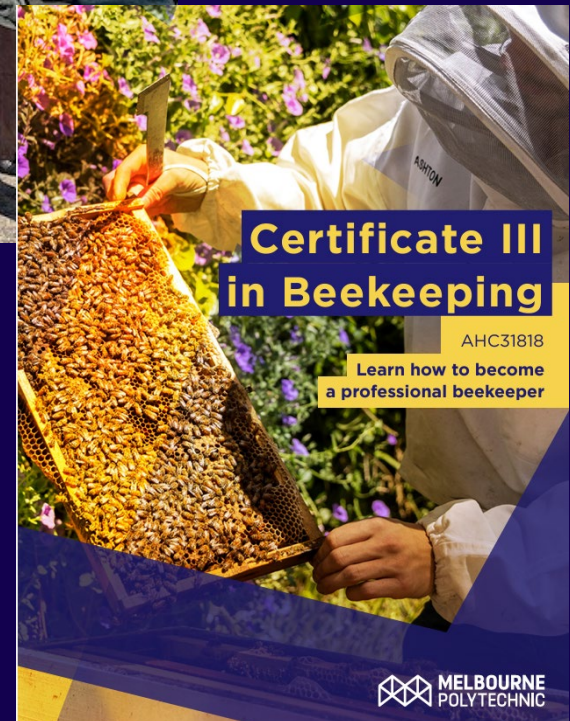
Clean Economy Workforce Development Strategy 2023–2033

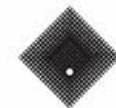
